**CLIENT**: REALITY CHECK RADIO

**POLL DATES**: Thursday 20 July 2023. The median response was collected on

Thursday 20 July 2023.

**TARGET POPULATION:** Adults in the Northland electorate.

SAMPLE POPULATION: Adults in the Northland electorate who are contactable on a

landline or mobile phone.

**SAMPLE SIZE**: 400 respondents agreed to participate.

**SAMPLE SELECTION**: A random selection of 5,000 phone numbers who live in

Northland.

**WEIGHTING**: The results are weighted to reflect the overall electorate voting

population in terms of gender and age.

**SAMPLE ERROR**: Based on this sample of 400 respondents, the maximum

sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 4.5%, at the 95%

confidence level.

**CODE COMPLIANCE:** This poll was conducted in accordance with the Research

Association New Zealand Code of Practice and the

International Chamber of Commerce/European Society for Opinion and Market Research Code on Market and Social

Research.
